Course Description:

Spanish 42 analyzes how different peoples and cultures have shaped the historical reality of the Iberian Peninsula: Iberian, Celts, Romans, Visigoths, Jews, Muslims, etc. All of them have played a major role in the configuration of today's Spain and Portugal. The course's main focus is in history, but it also analyzes cultural trends, architecture, and artistic and literary movements.

- To show students how national identities are a result of history and, consequently, they
 can experience radical changes in the way they are perceived when their historical
 situation changes.
